The Limpopo Department of Social Development (LDSD) is inviting interested and qualifying Non-Profit Organizations (NPOs) to respond to this request for proposals. To be considered for funding, the NPO must be registered as a social services NPO under the NPO Act, 71 of 1997, and operate in the Limpopo district municipalities. Those at the provincial level must have a footprint in at least three (3) or more districts. The funding is available to strengthen service delivery provided by NPOs to promote social development services in line with the mandate and relevant DSD policies and legislative frameworks.

1. Focus Areas

The qualifying NPOs will be considered for funding under the following Budget Sub-programmes:

SP2.2: Services to Older Persons

SP2.2.1. Community Service Centers for Older Persons

SP2.2.2. Residential Facilities for Older Persons

SP2.2.3. Provincial NPOs that are rendering services to older persons as per specifications.

SP2.3: Services to Persons with Disabilities

SP2.3.1. Residential facilities for persons living with disabilities.

SP2.3.2. Protective Workshops

SP2.3.3. Community-based rehabilitation (CBR) centers

SP2.3.4. Provincial NPO rendering services to persons with disabilities.

SP2.4: Community-Based HIV/AIDS Services

SP2.5: Social and Behaviour Change (SBC)

SP3.2: Care and Services to Families

SP3.2.1. Social Work Posts -Districts + Province

SP3.2.2. Provincial NPOs render Care and Services to families.

SP3.3: Child Care and Protection

SP3.3.1. Child & Youth Care Centers (CYCC)

SP3.3.2. Partial Care – (Stimulation Centers)

SP3.3.3. Social Work Posts -Districts + Province

SP3.6: Community-Based Care Services for Children

SP3.6.1. Drop-in Centers-(DIC)

SP4.2: Crime Prevention and Support

SP4.2.1. Social Work Posts -Districts + Province

SP4.2.2. Provincial + Districts NPO is rendering social crime prevention services.

SP4.3: Victim Empowerment Programme

SP4.3.1. Victim Empowerment Centers

SP4.3.2. Victim Empowerment Shelters

SP4.3.3. Provincial NPO is rendering VEP.

SP4.4: Substance Abuse, Prevention, and Rehabilitation

SP4.4.1. Community Substance Abuse Centers

SP4.4.2. Outpatient Centers

SP4.4.3. Provincial NPOs that are rendering prevention and rehabilitation services.

Funding is guided by planning and budgeting for the delivery of social development services. It will be informed by the responsibilities of government set out in the Constitution and sector legislation, demographic information and social development indicators, community development needs, and program-specific priorities, service areas, and geographic priorities (Mapping of services).

2. Eligibility Criteria

Funding will not be historical, and potential NPOs will be eligible for financing from the Limpopo DSD after signing a three-year level agreement if they meet the criteria and are compliant with the applicable governance, financial management, banking, and reporting requirements as follows:

2.1. Governance Requirements

NPOs must be registered under the Non-Profit Organisations Act, No. 71, 1997, and compliant with its provisions. The registration status will be verified with the NPO Directorate, and where necessary, the organization may be required to submit additional documents.

In dual registration, where an NPO is registered as a Trust and/or Non-Profit Company (NPC), it must also be registered and fully compliant with the NPO Act 71 of 1997 provisions.

Proper governance and management structures and practices must be in place.

De-registered organizations non-compliant with the NPO Act, Public Finance Management Act (PFMA), service/programme registration, etc., will not be considered.

Services and operations of the NPO must be operating in Limpopo district municipalities, and those at the provincial level must have a footprint in at least three (3) or more districts (provide proof of such existence and operations).

NPOs that demonstrate and contribute towards transforming the broader Social Development Sector will be considered.

2.2. Service Registration

An NPO must be registered or have at least a conditional registration in the case of services where such registration is a legislative requirement (provide proof of registration).

Where applicable, employees of an NPO will be vetted against the Child Protection Register and Sexual Offences Register (provide proof).

NPOs must demonstrate the capability and understanding to provide services according to specified minimum norms and standards and shall have no history of non-compliance to established minimum norms and standards.

If there is no legislative requirement, the organization must demonstrate its capability and track record to render the service applied for.

2.3. Financial Considerations

Full compliance regarding the previous funding cycle, (where applicable); however, previous funding does not guarantee future financial awards.

Must have financial management and internal control systems applicable to the entity in compliance with the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA).

Must have a bank account in the name of the entity.

Comply with the funding requirements applicable to the specific service and

Must present no history of severe financial mismanagement or contract violations (this applies to previously funded organizations).

3. How to Apply

The scope of the services to be provided through the program or other intervention is described in each Service Specification, including how the proposals will be evaluated.

All applications must be completed per the relevant Service Specification using the Department's application forms (i.e., the business plan). All the sections must be fully completed in line with the service specifications for the service applied for.

All applying NPOs must attend a compulsory or mandatory Briefing Session arranged for 11-15 September 2023 from 9h00 to 13h00 as per the attached annexure indicating the venues, dates, and times. Two representatives from an NPO, preferably the Chairperson and the Manager or Director or delegated person by the board.

Fully completed proposal and originals of ALL supporting documentation must be submitted by hand to the identified local DSD offices on or before the 29th of September 2023 at 12h00. No late application will be considered.
