This is the time where most of the children are engaging in drugs and substance abuse which lead to them having unprotected sexual activities before time.

If your child is going to a party:

Contact the parents of the party organisers.

Talk to your children about your expectations and give advise.

Do not give your children large amounts of cash.

Make it clear that they cannot leave the party and go to another without getting your permission.

You (or a trusted parent) should pick them up at the agreed time and place but they should also know that they can phone you at any stage if they need to leave.

Sleepovers are a no-no, unless you have reason to trust the host family completely. Check last minute sleepover plans very thoroughly with the host parents.

Be awake when your children return home, or have them wake you. Talk to them for a while.

Why Commemorate World Aids Day?

The World Aids Day is one of the major international events that are commemorated once in a year on the 1st December. The event is an opportunity to unite communities in the fight against HIV and AIDS, show support to people living with HIV and families of those affected.

On 31 March 2017, SANAC Chairperson Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa launched South Africa’s National Strategic Plan for HIV, TB and STIs 2017 - 2022 (NSP), which serves as a roadmap for the next stage of the country’s journey towards a future where these three diseases are no longer public health challenges.

The NSP is a key pillar in the country’s progress towards achieving universal health care, as it is driven by South Africa’s long term vision reflected in the National Development Plan of a healthier, stronger and more equitable nation.

The Department of Social Development contribute to the achievement of Provincial World Aids Day by offering the following services:

- Facilitating conversation sessions with young people
- Providing substance abuse awareness sessions
- Facilitating financial wellness sessions in the workplace to reduce vulnerability.
- Distributing condoms in all work stations
- Coordinating on-site HIV Counselling and Testing
- Facilitating family preservation programme
- Facilitate social and Behavioural change communication programme
- Identifying child and youth headed families for provision of food parcels.
- Creating HIV awareness sessions in the workplace.
