

**SPEECH BY MEC MAPULA MOKABA-PHUKWANA TO THE STAFF OF THE  
DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT ON 03 NOVEMBER 2017 AT THE  
DEPARTMENTAL BOARD ROOM**

**Thlogo ya lefapha, Mohumagadi Ramokgopa, le ba shumi ka wena mo lefaphang  
la tsa Thlabololo Leago, re a le Tamisa, Re re Gooie More and Good Morning.**

As political office bearers we are voted into power by the electorates to represent their expectations. To that extent, the reshuffling of provincial cabinet and our deployment to any office is the prerogative of the Premier. Such redeployment **may** be undertaken in consultation with members of the legislature, executive and the political parties.
