Dr. Namane Dickson Masemola is the new MEC to lead the Department of Social Development. During a meet and greet session at Olympic Towers, the head office building of the Department, MEC was introduced to the executive and senior management of the Department.

Addressing the team, MEC Masemola emphasized that, "Our people demand nothing less but our best and therefore we dare not fail. We are ready to mobilise our communities to play a crucial role in fighting all the social ills like Gender Based Violence and Femicide, substance abuse and more, as we endeavour to build a better society".

MEC Masemola is no stranger to the public of Limpopo. He has served as the MEC for Education, Transport and Community Safety as well as Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure. He holds various Postgraduate Degrees and Certificates as well as a PhD in Administration. He is a husband and father, who is born and bred in Ga-Marishane, in the Sekhukhune district. He cut his political teeth at a young age owing to various influences that ranged from senior political leaders to progressive royalty.

As an active young person he participated in the village youth structures and also mobilization of the Marishane Mountain Lions Football Club and Marishane Youth Organisation under SEYO which was part of SAYCO. He became part of the student movement and the broader youth movement where he led in various capacities in the SANSCO (South African National Students Congress), SASCO (South African Student Organisation) and the SRC (Student Representative Council) at Dr CN Phatudi College.

He began his involvement in the African National Congress while still a youth and participated in the processes of rebuilding structures of the ANC in the country after the unbanning of the ANC. He was a volunteer and Party Agent of the ANC in the first democratic elections in 1994 and grew through the ranks of the ANC from the then Marishane Branch until the most senior Provincial level where he became the ANC Provincial Deputy Chairperson, having led the ANC in Sekhukhune Region in many capacities as well as becoming the Regional Chairperson earlier.

He has contributed immensely in local government sphere where he served in various roles including participating in processes that led to the formation of SALGA (South African Local Government Association), facilitated a Session of International Union of Local Authorities (IULA) Conference in Mafikeng, attended the United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG) Founding Congress in France. He also served as Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District Municipality for three terms.





MEC Namane Dickson Masemola joined fellow members of the Executive Council and other dignitaries at Ukuthula Primary School, Mageva Village in Greater-Giyani Municipality, for this year's provincial Nelson Mandela Day activities. This year's Nelson Mandela Day was celebrated under the theme: "Do what you can, with what you have, where you are".

Before the main event which involved planting seedlings and trees at the school, MEC Masemola handed over social relief of distress to a vulnerable family who recently lost one of their young relatives in a horrific road accident.

LUCKAU GDPS EMPOWER YOUTH

Luckau Community Development practitioners are making remarkable changes in the lives of the youth at Luckau, Sekhukhune district. Since the beginning of this 2022/23 financial year they have been working tirelessly to empower the youth to develop their livelihoods. Mr. Tshivhase, a community development worker, indicated that the youth in rural

areas are plagued by many social ills such as unemployment, drugs, and crime, hence Community Development (ComDev) services are crucial in the community. Community Development is a division in the Department of Social Development outside of Social Work services which works closely with non-government and community-based organizations on community projects and programmes focusing on community development to ameliorate the lives of people.Ms. Manyaka, a fellow ComDev worker, added that the youth have a potential which they are probably unaware of, so they need to be assisted to awaken their true potential and be empowered to do things for themselves and by themselves so that they can change their lives.

The Luckau office of ComDev have been working hand in glove with the National Youth Development Agency (NYDA) from Groblersdal, to empower youth on business management, funding and applications. When rendering their services, the Comdev practitioners involve different interest groups, stakeholders, people whose livelihood projects are geared at improvement; government and non-governmental bodies; funding organizations; project experts and executors. These stakeholders work together to bring a significant change to the lives of people in various communities.

On the 27th July 2022 MEC Dr Namane Dickson Masemola conducted door to door visits to the families of the victims of gender based violence (GBV) at Mankweng and surrounding areas in the Capricorn District on 27th July 2022. The campaign is aimed at creating awareness among people regarding Gender Based Violence and Femicide. The MEC was briefed at Andrew Mehlape Social Development offices before setting off to the three families. The National DSD command council, ward councilors, the SAPS, social workers and community development workers among others, were part of the campaign.

MEC Masemola visited 3 families in Ga Molepo, Mamotintane and Mentz respectively, handing over food hampers, blankets and care packages. At the first house visited, the MEC was deeply touched by the incident of GBV in which the woman was shot in the head by her partner and needed further medical care, as

the bullet was still lodged in her head. In the other families assisted, were survivors of rape or multiple rapes, and the MEC promised the families that they will get the proper assistance with regards to shelter, health, and food. He reiterated that we need to bring an end to gender-based violence.

The next day, on the 28th, saw stakeholders such as advocacy groups, civil society organisations, social workers, community development workers and the SAPS gather at Andrew Mehlape DSD Office terrain, for GBVF dialogues and a feedback session. Under discussion was, amongst others, power dynamics in

communities, root causes and contributing factors for GBVF and the economic development and emancipation of women. In his reply to the outcomes of the dialogues, MEC Masemola reiterated that the church needs to play a fundamental role in restoring the


moral fabric of society and that society needs a reconstruction of the soul, in the words of the late former president Nelson Mandela, whose birth month—among others—was the reason for the intensifying of the fight



against GBVF. All information from the feedback sessions will be used at the Presidential summit on GBVF.
